Describe initiatives, processes or practices that you have implemented during your chosen reporting period that have improved packaging sustainability

KARL STORZ Endoscopy Australia have engaged with VISY during 2022 to find a supplier with forward thinking and closed loop packaging and recycling solutions that align with customer and industry needs. Visy ensures the packaging solutions are consistently among the best in the world. In addition, Visy is certified as Forest Stewardship Council which is a Chain of Custody certification for all of Visy Board corrugated sites and is now selling FSC certified board grades that are sourced from responsible materials. The partnership with Visy should be completed by JUN 2023.

Describe any opportunities or constraints that affected performance within your chosen reporting period

Constraints; As we have said in past years, KARL STORZ Australia has no opportunity to affect primary packaging arrived (imported) from our mother Company.

KARL STORZ Australia's subsidiary is not the Manufacturer and as such and by law, replace or repack the medical goods replacing its primary packaging. The medical goods must remain in the original sealed packaging from Manufacturer.

We sourced secondary Packaging as cartons and packing material as Tapes, bubble wrap, docu-envelopes and Packing stretch film from local suppliers that provide recyclable or Biodegradable packing materials.
